TO THE MINISTER FOR JUSTICE.

I respectfully beg to submit my report pursuant to the 24th section of the Public Records (Ireland) Act, 1867, on the proceedings had during the years 1951-61 in connection with the public records.

1. The receipt of records has during this period continued in the normal manner.

A feature of recent years in the activities of the Public Record Office has been the increasing amount of work which has had to be undertaken in connection with departmental records. Transfers of such records are gradually becoming more frequent, and visits of inspection are also being made at the request of outside departments. It is to be expected that as government offices find themselves more and more embarrassed by the accumulation of their records, this side of the work of the Public Record Office will come even more into prominence.

2. Accessions for the period 1951-61 are listed in appendix I to this report. These include 10 volumes of calendars of patent rolls I E VI-44 Eliz. I prepared for the Irish Record Commissioners of 1810-1830. They appear to have passed out of public custody before 1831, when a return of material left behind by the Commission was made to the House of Commons; this does not mention them(1). A later and more detailed return, made in 1866, mentions a volume of transcripts for 38 and 39 Eliz., years missing from the present series(2). The question of their existence was the subject of controversy in the 1860's, when J. T. Gilbert, under the pseudonym of "An Irish Archivist," attacked the calendar of patent rolls, Henry VIII-Eliz. I, which had been prepared by James Morrin of the Rolls Office and published in 1861 and 1862. Gilbert's contention was that Morrin had acquired the calendar made for the Record Commission, suppressed it, and used it without acknowledgment; Morrin maintained that no such calendar had ever been made. Neither disputant seems to have been aware that in the surviving monthly work sheets or reports made by the various clerks and transcribers employed by the commission there was clear proof that calendars for the period had been made. A detailed comparison of the calendars now acquired with Morrin's edition does, however, suggest that the two versions were made independently and that in this particular, if in no other, Gilbert's charges were unfounded.

- 3. A large quantity of records relating to national schools was received from the Department of Education, including registers and salary books dating from 1834–35. The former contain minutes of all kinds of action taken with regard to particular schools, and may thus be found useful by the local historian, while the latter render possible the tracing of many individuals of whom there might otherwise be little record.
- 4. A particularly interesting acquisition is that of a file of letters and copies of letters exchanged between Michael Collins and Toirdhealbhach Mac Suibhne about the raising of the Dáil Éireann loan in Co. Cork from July 1919 to September 1921.
- 5. The series of testamentary documents acquired by presentation and purchase has now reached no. T15404, that of deeds no. D23773 and that of miscellaneous documents no. M6068.

6. In summer 1955 the roof of the record treasury, a temporary structure intended to serve only until the completion of the building by the addition of further stories, developed numerous leaks and was reasphalted. A room in the basement was fitted up as a work room and is now in constant use for sorting and arranging documents. Shelving was installed in the remainder of the basement. This should provide space for the storage of records from the probate registries and offices of county registrars for something like fourteen years. Further accommodation will then become necessary. The basement photographic room was found unsuitable owing to difficulties of ventilation, and the photographic equipment has been moved to the top story of the office block.

Lists, Indexes and Transcripts.

10. Index volumes of wills and administrations for the years 1918–1922 were compiled from the card indexes already existing.

The general card indexing system has been extended and now consists of:

A card index has been prepared to the will extracts, 1765-1858, in the Office of Charitable Donations and Bequests.

Publication and Binding.

11. The Calendar of Justiciary Rolls, 1308–1314, prepared before 1922, was revised by the Deputy Keeper and appeared in December, 1956. The surviving original roll, for 1312-1314, has been transcribed for publication, and a calendar in English has been prepared to accompany the text. The fifth and final volume in the Public Record Office series of early statutes, extending to the 28th year of Henry VIII, was prepared for the press by the Assistant Deputy Keeper and should appear before long.

The publication of the census of the diocese of Elphin taken in 1749 by the parochial clergy of the established church for the bishop, Edward Synge, has been undertaken by the Irish Manuscripts Commission, and the text is being edited by Mr. B. Mac Giolla Choille, Assistant Deputy Keeper of the Records.

A list of patentee officers, 1173-1826, based on the Lodge MSS in the Public Record Office and on the printed *Liber Munerum*, prepared for the Irish MSS Commission by Mr. James L. J. Hughes, formerly Assistant in the Public Record Office, was published in

12. Down Survey Barony Map no. 4 was lent and a copy of Boundary Survey Map no. 3. 1905 was supplied for the exhibition of maps arranged by the Ordnance Survey Office and the Geographical Society of Ireland and held in the Library of T.C.D. in autumn and winter 1961-2.

Photostats of pages from the Kilmainham gaol register, 1798-1814, were supplied to the Kilmainham Gaol Restoration Committee for the purpose of an exhibition held in Carlisle Buildings, D'Olier Street, in spring 1961.

Photographic Equipment.

13. A photostat apparatus was installed in March 1951, to serve the Public Record Office and the Land Registry, and two temporary clerical assistants were appointed as operators, one of whom was borne on the vote for the Public Record Office and the other on the vote for the Land Registry. A paperkeeper, borne on the Land Registry vote, and a messenger, borne on the Public Record Office vote, were later substituted.

Fees for Copies, Etc.

14. A new scale of fees, based on number and size of photographs rather than on number of words, was authorized by the Minister on 25 March 1955. The scale authorizes different charges for plain copies and for those sealed and certified under the Public Records (Ireland) Act of 1867. The cheaper plain copies are generally sufficient for the purposes of the historical student, while sealed and certified copies are necessary for legal use. The introduction of the distinction brings the Public Record Office into line with general modern practice. The following table shows the receipts under the various heads for the years 1951–1961, including fees for copies of State Papers:

Literary Searches.

15. Certificates to the number of 734 were granted for inspection of records for literary purposes. The subjects of investigation included:—local, ecclesiastical and family history, topography and place names, emigration, shipping, fisheries, the legal system in the 13th and 14th centuries, the Scottish wars of Edward I and Edward II in relation to Ireland, the mediaeval exchequer, the plantation of Ely O'Carroll, the Irish administration under Elizabeth I and James I, the Williamite confiscations, the Penal Laws, the United Irishmen and the rising of 1798, the Great Famine, the Ribbon organizations, the iron industry in Ireland, commercial relations with France from 1660 to 1800, municipal corporations in the 18th century, the Charter Schools, the Dublin Wide Streets Commissioners, Dublin gilds, the co-operative movement, the lives of Thomas Allen, M.P. 1763–1785, bishop Berkeley, Sir William Betham, admiral Browne

of the Argentine, Edmund Burke, lord Cornwallis, Arthur O Frighil, archbishop of Tuam 1538-1555, brother Edmund Ignatius Rice, Sir Hans Sloane, Myler Magrath, archbishop of Cashel 1579-1622, and viscount Townshend, Lord Lieutenant 1767-1772.

Proceedings under the Parochial Records Acts.

16. Returns as to the condition and safe keeping of parish records in local custody under retention orders were received in 1955. One visit of inspection was made. The copying of the parish registers of the Church of Ireland which are governed by the Public Records (Ireland) Act, 1867, Amendment Act, 1875, has been undertaken, and the dioceses of Killaloe, Kilfenora, Clonfert and Kilmacduagh, Cashel, Emly, Waterford and Lismore and Cork, Cloyne and Ross have been completed.

Archive Organizations.

18. The third International Congress on Archives was held at Florence from 25 to 29 September 1956. The Public Record Office was represented by Mr. B. Mac Giolla Choille, Assistant Deputy Keeper and Keeper of the State Papers.

The Public Record Office has continued to receive valuable additions through the British Records Association, notably the large collection of Fitzpatrick papers (see Appendix I, sec. g.).

In March, 1956 the Public Record Office became a corporate member of the Irish Institute for Documentation.

Staff.

19. Mr. Diarmid Coffey, Assistant Deputy Keeper, retired on 24 June 1956. On Mr. Coffey's retirement I was appointed Deputy Keeper and Mr. Breandan Mac Giolla Choille, Assistant, was appointed Assistant Deputy Keeper and Keeper of the State Papers. One assistant retired in 1956; no appointments have been made in the assistant grade during the period covered by this report. One clerical officer and one typist were transferred and were replaced, and one temporary clerical assistant was transferred. One first class searcher retired and was replaced. There were three retirements by second class searchers, two of whom were replaced by paperkeepers.

In accordance with the provisions of the Ministers' and Secretaries Act, 1924, the report of the Keeper of State Papers was submitted to An Taoiseach and is printed herewith.

Tuarascáil í seo ar an obair a rinneadh in Oifig na Státpháipéar, Caisleán Bhaile Átha Cliath, ó thús 1951 go deireadh 1961. Bhíos freagrach i gcoimeád na státpháipéar ó lár 1956 ar aghaidh.

- 1. I rith tréimhse na tuarascála seo rinneadh dhá chuardach agus daichead i measc na státpháipéar d'fhonn teacht ar eolas do ranna agus d'oifigí rialtais agus fágann sin go ndearnadh 1298 cuardach den chineál seo idir 1922 agus 1961. Tugadh comhaid ar iasacht do Roinn an Taoisigh, don Roinn Talmhaíochta, don Roinn Oideachais, don Roinn Airgeadais agus don Roinn Dlí agus Cirt, agus d'Oifig an Ard-Aighne, agus tar éis na hiasachta cuireadh na doiciméid i dtaisce arís.
- 2. Tugadh cead cuardaigh sna státpháipéir do 146 duine agus déanann sé sin 246 mar iomlán na gcead do na blianta 1922-61. Tháinig méadú ar líon na n-iarratas, go háirithe i 1961 nuair a ceadaíodh do shé dhuine fhichead don chéad uair taighde a dhéanamh sna státpháipéir.
- 3. De bhrí go raibh orainn tabhairt faoin fhoirgneamh a dheisiú i gcaitheamh bhlianta na tuarascála seo, cuireadh bacainn mhór ar ghnáthobair na hoifige. Measadh sa bhliain 1955 nár mhór iniúchadh amuigh agus istigh a dhéanamh gan mhoill ar bhallaí an túir. I dtreo agus go mbeadh caoi isteach ag an lucht deisithe agus freisin i dtreo agus go laghdófaí an meáchan ar urláir an túir, aistríodh tuairim 930 troigh chiúbach de státpháipéir chuig an Oifig Irisí Poiblí i mBealtaine 1955. De dhroim riachtanais, ní de réir phrionsabail chartlannaíochta ach de réir a n-ionaid sa túr a roghnaíodh na cáipéisí don aistriú, agus mar gheall ar an deighilt ab éigean dúinn a dhéanamh ar a lán cineálacha státpháipéar, is iomaí sin cuardach nach féidir a chríochnú gan cáipéisí san dá oifig a scrúdú. Ní bheidh deireadh leis an deacracht seo go dtí go n-athaontaítear san Oifig Irisí Poiblí nó in Oifig na Státpháipéar na cineálacha státpháipéar atá faoi láthair san dá thaisceadán sin.
- 4. Tar éis dúinn an t-aistriú cáipéisí a chur i gcrích i samhradh 1955, deisíodh an balla i sáinn B, seomra VI. Ina dhiaidh sin iniúchadh an t-urlár i ngach seomra ach go háirithe i seomra VIII mar a bhfuil an ceann is ísle de cheithre urlár an túir. Mar bhuntaca don urlár sin tá meall mór de chloich eibhir ina lár, é suite go daingean agus ballaí ísle brící ag imeacht mar ghaethe amach ón lár go dtí imlíne an tseomra. D'fhonn tacaíocht a thabhairt do na hurláir i seomraí VII, VI agus sa chiorcal i mbarr an túir, cuireadh colúin chruach ina seasamh ar urlár sheomra VIII agus ar an dá urlár os a chionn. Thart timpeall ar an oscailt in urlár sheomra VIII feistíodh bóna cruach ar bharr na gcolún. Feistíodh bónaí cruach do na colúin i seomraí VI agus VII mar a chéile agus críochnaíodh an obair seo i Márta 1959.

Glanadh seomraí an túir agus a raibh iontu le haonad folúsghlantóireacht in Aibreán agus i mBealtaine 1959, agus sna míonna dár gcionn péinteáileadh iad. Rinneadh athnuachan ar na fearais leictreachais, cuireadh leo agus feabhsaíodh go mór soilsiú an túir dá bharr. I measc na nithe eile a rinne Oifig na nOibreacha Poiblí dúinn, ní mór iad seo a lua: deisiú seilfeanna nó cur leo i seomraí III, VI agus VIII agus athchóiriú na seomraí d'oifigigh agus do lucht taighde sa chaoi go bhfuil anois dhá sheomra ann agus spiara gloine agus adhmaid eatarthu. In áit an tine oscailte a bhí san oifig, cuireadh isteach téiteoirí leictreachais. Tá troscánú an dá sheomra á fheabhsú.

- 5. Ar na doiciméid a aistríodh go dtí an Oifig Irisí Poiblí (de réir mar a míníodh in alt 3), bhí Páipéir an Éirí Amach (1790-1808), Páipéir Staid na Tíre (1790-1831), na Páipéir Oifigiúla (1790-1831), sraith II. Ón bhliain 1955 ar aghaidh is ar an Oifig Irisí Poiblí ab éigean don taighdeoir triall chun na doiciméid seo a léamh.
- 6. Nuair a críochnaíodh an deisiú agus an t-athchóiriú sin tosaíodh i 1959 ar atheagar a chur ar na doiciméid sa túr.

Tar éis bhunú an tSaorstáit agus dúnadh Oifig an Phríomh-Rúnaí i gCaisleán Bhaile Átha Cliath, b'éigean an dubhchuid cáipéisí a thabhairt isteach faoi dheifir in Oifig na Státpháipéar agus dá bharr sin níorbh fhéidir cloí leis an chroneolaíocht ná leis an ord leanúnach féin fiú sna cineálacha céanna cáipéisí. Is amhlaidh a cuireadh cartúin lán de cháipéisí cibé áit a raibh spás ann dóibh. Bailiúcháin mhóra ar nós Irisí Bhord na bPríosún Ginearálta, ní in aon tseomra amháin a cuireadh iad ach i gcúig cinn de sheomraí agus ansin féin b'éigean na cartúin a thógáil ceann ar cheann ar gach cuid den urlár a bhí saor, fiú amháin os comhair na bhfuinneog. Thuas i mbarr an túir (i seomra III) a bhí na clárleabhair agus na treoracha don phríomhshraith doiciméad—páipéir chláraithe Oifig an Phríomh-Rúnaí, a raibh cuid acu ar an urlár céanna agus an fuilleach ar na hurláir thíos. Chuireadh na toscaí sin moill ar na hoifigigh le linn dóibh bheith ag déanamh cuardach sna státpháipéir nó á liostáil.

De réir an scéim atheagraithe tá beartaithe againn an líon leabhar is mó is féidir a thabhairt anuas chuig seomra VIII i dtreo agus go mbeidh ansin, ar an leibhéal is ísle, seomra tagartha agus treoracha. Tá sé i gceist againn freisin na státpháipéir a athphacáil ionas go laghdófar ar an bhrú gach áit is féidir sin a dhéanamh. Tá beartaithe againn chomh maith eagar nua a chur ar na státpháipéir i dtreo agus go mbeidh ar deireadh iomlán na bpáipéar i ngach sraith agus i ngach bliain de gach sraith i gcomhgar a chéile.

I rith 1960 aistríodh clárleabhair agus treoirleabhair na bpáipéar cláraithe de chuid Oifig an Phríomh-Rúnaí, 1818-1922, chuig seomra VIII. Tugadh le chéile leabhair Oifig na Príomh-Chomhairle ar fad in aon bhall amháin, seomra VI, mar aon leis na páipéir chomhfhreagracha do na blianta 1871-1922. Laghdaíodh ar an bhrú nuair a rinneadh athphacáil agus comhdhlúthú ar na sraitheanna seo cáipéisí:

Bord na bPríosún Ginearálta, páipéir 1878-1900. Oifig an Phríomh-Rúnaí, ceadúnas airm agus aimiúnuisin, páipéir 1875-1912.

REPORT OF THE KEEPER OF STATE PAPERS

TO THE TAOISEACH

This is a report of the work done in the State Paper Office, Dublin Castle, from the beginning of 1951 to the end of 1961. I have been charged with the custody of the state papers since July 1956.

- 1. During the period of this report forty two searches were made for Government departments and offices, bringing the total to 1298 for the years 1922-61. Files were sent on loan to and returned from the departments of the Taoiseach, Agriculture, Education, Finance and Justice and the office of the Attorney-General.
- 2. Permission to inspect state papers was granted to 146 persons, bringing the total to 246 for the years 1922-61. The number of applications increased over the period but particularly in 1961 when 26 new permissions were granted to research students.
- 3. The routine work of the office was considerably hampered by the structural repairs which had to be undertaken during the period of this report. Examination of the interior and exterior walls of the tower was deemed urgent in 1955 and, to facilitate this examination and to lessen the burden on the floors, approximately 930 cubic feet of state papers were transferred to the Public Record Office. Of necessity, the selection of documents for this transfer was made not according to archival principles but according to location in the tower. The resulting partition of many classes of documents has brought difficulties which will continue until it becomes possible to re-unite the documents in the affected classes either in the State Paper Office or in the Public Record Office.
- 4. Following the removal of the state papers, repairs were carried out in recess B room VI in the summer of 1955. The floors in the tower were then examined and it was found that the support of the lowest of the four floors (room VIII) consists of a large central granite rock solidly founded with brick walls radiating from it. In order to support the upper floors, steel columns were carried from the lowest to the top floor and fixed with steel collars at the openings. This work was completed in March 1959.

In April-May 1959 the eight rooms in the tower and their contents were vacuum-cleaned and in the following months the rooms were painted. The electrical wiring and fittings were renewed and extended to give improved lighting throughout the building. Among other improvements completed by the Office of Public Works were the repair and extension of shelving in rooms III, VI and VIII and the rearrangement of accommodation for officials and research students to give two rooms divided by a wooden and glass partition. Electrical heating was installed in the reading room and office. The furnishing of these rooms is being improved.

- 5. Among the documents removed to the Public Record Office (as explained in paragraph 3) were the Rebellion Papers (1790–1808), the State of the Country Papers (1790–1831), and the Official Papers 1790–1831, series II. Since 1955 students inspecting these papers have attended at the Public Record Office.
- 6. On completion of the repairs and improvements described, a re-organization of the contents of the tower was begun in 1959.

Owing to the unprecedented bulk of state papers transferred following the political changes of 1922, it became impossible to maintain the arrangement of documents in chronological and consecutive order, class by class. Cartons were placed wherever space permitted and large accessions like the records of the General Prisons Board had to be spread over a number of rooms filling all available shelf, floor and window space. The indexes and registers to the main series of documents—the registered papers of the Chief Secretary's Office—were kept at the top of the tower in room III and the corresponding papers at the same or lower levels. These factors impeded the consultation and cataloguing of the state papers.

The present scheme of re-organization includes the transfer of the maximum number of books down to room VIII so as to form an index and reference room at the lowest level. It also includes the re-packing of the state papers so as to relieve congestion wherever possible. Another item in the scheme is the re-arrangement of the state papers in chronological order class by class, keeping as far as possible the distinct classes in close proximity.

During 1960 the registers and indexes to the registered papers of the Chief Secretary's Office, 1818-1922, were removed to room VIII. All the Privy Council Office books and the corresponding papers for 1871-1922 were brought together in room VI. Congestion has been relieved by the re-packing in a more compact form of the following classes of documents:

General Prisons Board papers, 1878-1900.
Chief Secretary's Office, arms & ammunition licences papers, 1875-1912.
Privy Council Office, railway files, 1884-1900.
Privy Council Office, papers, 1870-1922.

This stage of concentration was reached by moving 2515 cartons, 383 parcels and 482 volumes. Where possible, repacking was done and the contents of 1128 cartons were cleaned. Most of the 2515 cartons had not been moved since their original deposit in the tower and during the re-arrangement a large number disintegrated. So far 484 of these cartons have been replaced.

- 7. The calendar to Prisoners' Petitions and Cases, 1778-1836 (Rep. D.K. 58, p.15) was completed and an index to the calendar of official papers, 1790-1831, series II, is now available. An index to names of persons obtaining passports or mentioned in police reports as persons intending to serve in the Papal Army in Italy in 1860 was made and is printed as an appendix to this report.
- 8. Eighty registers and indexes to the registered papers of the Chief Secretary's Office and two calendars of State of the Country papers were rebound. Forty-one volumes in the reference library were rebound.
- 9. A scale of fees for photographic or other copies of state papers was authorised by the Taoiseach on 12 September 1956. Fees paid for copies are included in the returns given in paragraph 14 of the 59th report of the Deputy Keeper.

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APPENDIX II.

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QUIT RENT OFFICE COLLECTION-1798 PAPERS

The Quit Rent Office collection, deposited in the Public Record Office in 1943 on the closing of the Quit Rent Office premises at No. 10 Ormond Quay, contains a quantity of papers relating to the forfeited property of Lord Edward Fitzgerald, Beauchamp Bagenal Harvey and Cornelius Grogan, apparently from the Forfeiture Office. A few documents relating to Archibald Hamilton Rowan and to Robert Emmet are also included. The greater number relate to Bagenal Harvey and to Grogan, the most interesting being the minutes of evidence in their favour given before secret sessions of the House of Commons on 22 and 24 August 1798 (no. 5 below), in the course of the proceedings leading to the passing of the act of attainder against them and Lord Edward Fitzgerald, which received the royal assent on 6 October.

Beauchamp Bagenal Harvey of Bargy Castle, Co. Wexford, was aged 36 in 1798. He practised as a barrister and was associated with advanced political circles, being said to have joined the United Irishmen in 1792 (Reports of the informer, Thomas Collins, printed in Analecta Hibernica no. 17, p. 24). On the outbreak of the rising he was arrested on May 26 and placed in Wexford gaol, whether on any grounds other than general suspicion is not known. While there he executed a deed of settlement of his estates, antedated to 1 August 1797 (no. 139) in the hope of rendering them not liable to forfeiture. On the entry of the insurgents on May 30 he joined them, with exactly what motives it is not clear, and continued as commander in chief until he was superseded by Fr. Philip Roche on June 7. He then acted for a short time as president of the town committee in Wexford. On the collapse of the rising he took refuge in the Saltee Islands in the company of John Henry Colclough, another country gentleman who had been implicated. A revenue vessel was sent to search the islands and the two were arrested in a cave. They were brought to Wexford, tried by court martial, and executed, along with Cornelius Grogan, on 28 June.

Cornelius Grogan, of Johnstown Castle, Co. Wexford, was not actively concerned in the rising at all, but became involved when the insurgents reached Johnstown. He had tried to escape with the Wexford garrison to Duncannon fort, but being 70 years old and in poor health had been unable to ride so far. The insurgents brought him to Wexford, where he seems to have worked with them in some way in the matter of supplies, though it is likely that he was rather their prisoner than their officer. On the recovery of Wexford he returned to Johnstown, where he was arrested on June 23.

The doubtful legality of the trials of Harvey and Grogan placed the government in an embarrassing position from which they extricated themselves by passing an act of attainder against Harvey and Grogan as well as Lord Edward, which received the royal assent on 6 October, and was given restrospective force in order to legalize the executions. The House of Commons began a series of secret sessions on matters connected with the rising, particularly the proposed act of attainder. Harvey's brother James who was in England studying agriculture, came to Ireland early in August, in order to protect his interests (No. 72). He entered into the house and demesne of Bargy, but was shortly afterwards ejected by H.M. Collector of Customs for Co. Wexford (No. 24). Grogan's two surviving brothers, John and Overstreet Grogan Knox, also entered into possession of the Johnstown estate (no. 158).

On 4 April 1799 commissions issued for inquisitions into the property of Lord Edward Fitzgerald, Bagenal Harvey and Grogan (nos. 12, 16, 17, 33 and 152) and inquisitions were held in the summer (nos. 12, 16, 33 and 152). In November James Harvey and the Grogan brothers moved for liberty to traverse the inquisitions (nos. 33, 34 and 157). The Crown had in the meantime also begun proceedings to gain possession of the Harvey title deeds; these continued until late in 1801, when it seems that the deeds were obtained, on the discharge of the sums due to William Harvey and John Farran, Harvey's men of business (nos. 22–32). In January 1800 the Crown filed an information against the Grogan brothers, who were still in possession (no. 158). The Grogans succeeded in having the first inquisition quashed, but another was taken on 19 January 1801 (nos. 162 and 163). There are no further documents in the Grogan case but the Crown seems to have established its title. The estate was ultimately granted by patent to John Knox Grogan as appears from statements made by James Harvey

(no. 74). A register of patents compiled in the Rolls Office and now in the Public Record Office notes grants of land to John Grogan Knox on 6 May and 24 June 1803. The original patent rolls are not extant, and there is no calendar for this period. As regards the Harvey estates, James Harvey filed a declaration in ejectment on 2 July 1800 (no. 37) and the case came for hearing on 13 November (no. 42). James Harvey made good his title to certain lands which his brother had held in trust for him, but not to the bulk of the estate (no. 54). Numerous papers survive for the succeeding few years, relating to the settlement of the various claims now made on the estate by Harvey's relatives and other creditors. In February 1802 James Harvey petitioned that a lease be made to him of his brother's estates, which was granted. In April 1804 and September 1806 he was petitioning unsuccessfully that he be permitted to retain the rent due by him. In 1810 he petitioned for a grant, and a patent was issued to him on 22 September. The register of patents now in the Public Record Office notes two patents to him in 44 Geo. III. and patents enrolled on 25 September and 6 November 1810.

No. 5. EVIDENCE BEFORE A SECRET SESSION OF THE HOUSE OF COMMONS

The first part of the document consists of a summary of the evidence given of 22 August 1798 with regard to Cornelius Grogan. This evidence, in a fuller version in the form of question and answer, has been printed in Rowe's Interesting Cases(1), and is therefore not given here. It is possible that the committee books and papers, 1634–1800, which were among the parliamentary records in the Public Record Office until 1922, included the primary minutes of evidence, from which both the present document and Rowe's version of the portion relating to Grogan may have been compiled.

The following is the portion of the document relating to Bagenal Harvey and not given by Rowe.

24th AUGUST 1798

John Boxwell

Lived in barony Fort, co. Wexford, farmer. Knew Harvey some time before the rebellion. He called on his tenants to bring in their arms, which some of them did. Harvey desired witness to go to a priest of the name of Corish to direct the people to keep order in the parish and not to appear in numbers but keep proper hours. He always recommended peace.

Joseph Gladwin

Is jailer of Wexford and was there when the rebels took possession. Knew Harvey in prison at that time. On taking possession of the town the rebels

enlarged the prisoners by coming into the jail and turning them out. Vast numbers of the rebels came about the jail and 40 or 50 coming in. Harvey remained in the jail three hours after the rebels got possession. Two then came and took him out. Went out with Harvey 100 yards out of the jail, they did not force him. Harvey took witness's wife and children the next day and left them at Bargy. Has said he was afraid not a Protestant in the country but would be put to death. Said you will not be let to escape more than myself. Witness a Protestant, Orangeman and Protestant meant the same thing in county Wexford. Harvey said this a day or two after the rebels got possession of the town. Has expressed a wish to escape if he could. Was jailer while the rebels remained for one day and was removed until the King's troops retook Wexford. Harvey was in confinement on a charge of high treason. Believes the rebels would not have a man commanding at Ross that was not in their confidence.

Thomas Devereux

Blacksmith near Bargy. Knew Harvey in April last. Witness was attacked by two men to take an oath of secrecy which he refused. Harvey recommended him not to take it and said he was going to Dublin and from that to England as the country was going mad. Made no pikes until the army left Wexford. After that he made five or six.

Silvester Harpur

Was servant to Harvey when he was arrested. Went to see him on Whitsunday. Desired witness to go home and direct the people to keep quiet and to take their arms to Mr. Boxwell to be brought to Wexford and they were brought accordingly. Got arms from his servants which he delivered to Mr. Boyd at the Custom House of Wexford. Harvey was not a magistrate. Got some of his tenants to take the oath of allegiance the day he was arrested, and desired witness collect the tenants which he did.

Bryan Myler

County Wexford farmer. Knew Harvey. Saw him the Sunday before the battle of Ross. Saw Harvey near Ross. He saw a keg of powder forced from him and given to the rebels. Saw him relieve the prisoners and send them to their houses.

William Hughes

Of Wexford, merchant. Lieutenant in Wexford infantry. Was in Wexford after it was taken by the rebels. Saw Harvey on the evening of the day the rebels came in. Thinks Harvey disapproved of the proceedings and told witness they had gone much greater length than he expected. That Harvey said he had no connection with United Irishmen for two years before. Harvey said he took his situation at the head of affairs, to be able to protect his family and friends. Witness received great kindness from him. Harvey exerted himself to save others and to prevent acts of inhumanity. Knew Edward Turner to whom Harvey acted kind and exerted himself to save his life.

Revd. Richard Bevan

Lives in county Wexford. Harvey was at witnesses house about a week before the rebellion. He told witness that he thought the people should bring in their arms and take the oath of allegiance and seemed very zealous that they should. Went two days after to Harvey's house and saw numbers of arms in the hall which he was told Harvey had collected from the people round. After saw him in Wexford. He said he was very busy and taking a paper out of his pocket shewed an oath prepared for the people containing the oath of allegiance and a declaration that they had surrendered their arms and knowing of none being concealed. Boxwell told witness that Harvey had directed him to bring in the arms then in Harvey's house which were brought in and surrendered to the Mayor of Wexford. Harvey said that he would shew government that he could keep the barony of Forth and Bargy quiet. Knows Harvey's handwriting. Two letters produced. Read.

Mary Roche

Did live in Wexford. Knew Harvey. Saw him bring in arms. Has told her that he was going to England to his children to stay for some time. Said he was not apprehensive of going to Dublin and would rather be (taken)† in Dublin

than Wexford as he would be shewn some justice. Saw him in the jail. He did not attempt to escape. Afterwards in the jail Harvey said he hoped the army would quell the rebels. That was the day the North Cork Militia marched. Harvey cried the day the North Cork Militia were defeated and seemed much affected at it. Wished to escape when he heard the rebels got the town and did not wish to join them. Sent witness to every body he could depend upon to try to get a boat to go to England. Witness endeavoured to get a boat and got one, which was taken by some other person. Harvey much agitated when he found the boat was gone. Reported that the rebels would kill all the prisoners and heard the rebels say they would kill Harvey. Harvey went up the chimney to save himself from the rebels. Saw Harvey go to protect Mr. Lightburne's house. Saw a man with a drawn sword over Harvey's head and the rebels complained that Harvey favoured the Orange men and gave them passes and protection. Harvey protected Mr. Boyd's house. Saw him after the rebels left the town and he seemed quite rejoiced and said there was a prospect of peace. Endeavoured to prevail on Harvey to go away having seen Mr. Hoey* executed.

Bridget Roche

Saw Harvey a prisoner when a message was brought that the bridge was on fire. Harvey appeared much agitated and sorry. Captain Murphy told Harvey that he was commanded by the rebels to bring Harvey which he refused. Murphy had no men with him. Harvey was forced by 100 men, one of whom seized him by the coat. Heard him accused of being humane. Frequently saw him but never in uniform or with arms.

William Archer

Of Wexford, merchant. Was in Wexford after the rebels got possession. After Harvey was liberated it became necessary for witness to have two sureties for his remaining in the town. Witness applied to Harvey and was permitted to go home. Mr. Boyd was murdered opposite witnesses house. The mob threat-ened (witness)† to treat him the same way. Thomas Archer applied to Harvey for protection which Harvey promised to give as far as in his power. Harvey seemed greatly shocked at the murder of Boyd. Harvey did everything in his power to protect the persons obnoxious to the rebels. Harvey took witness to his own house where others were and all were in consequence protected. Thousands surrounded Harvey's house and called for the persons by name. Harvey declared he had not taken any political part for the last two years.

Mrs. Mary Harvey

Of Mount Pleasant, coy. Wexford. Knew Harvey; he dined with her about a week after the rebellion. One of his tenants called for him at witness's house. Harvey ordered him to bring his arms to Mr. Boyd in Wexford and to order the tenantry to do the same and that they were to attend the next Saturday at Wexford to take the oath of allegiance. Frequently saw Harvey while the rebels were in Wexford. Heard him say that Captain Boyd and his corps would return to Wexford and that she might expect him after the army quitted Wexford. The rebels repeatedly called for Harvey at his lodgings. Harvey went with reluctance. Harvey acted with great humanity. Knows James Harvey the petitioner. He has been in England for 5 years.

Letters read. dated 26th May to Mrs. Harvey. Hopes the alarms are dispelled. Expresses pleasure at being in the country and that he had influenced the people to give up arms and take the oath of allegiance and would remain for the same purpose.

Not dated, to James Harvey. States his being taken. That he has a clear conscience and had been of service in quieting the country.

There are 11 names in the Carrick-on-Suir may belong either to Tipperary or Waterford

The notebook from which this transcript was made was originally the property of the late Inspector Jennings of the Royal Irish Constabulary who compiled it from documents in the Public Record Office and elsewhere. It was later purchased by the late Very Rev. Canon McGuirk P.P. who bequeathed it to the library of the Christian Brothers' Schools in North Richmond Street, Dublin. Through the co-operation of Rev. Brother W. Allen the notebook was temporarily deposited in the Public Record Office where it was copied and compared in

The P.R.O. original book from which the Jennings notes were taken is referred to in Appendix 2 to the 42 Deputy Keeper's Report, page 79. Under the caption Catholic Qualification Rolls the following description is given: "The Statute 13 & 14 Geo. III Ir. c. 35 (entitled "An Act to enable his Majesty's subjects of whatever persuasion to testify their allegiance to him ") enacted that from and after the 1st June 1774 any Catholic might take and subscribe the oath and declaration set out in the Act. This oath might be taken before the Judges of the King's Bench or before any Justice of the Peace or Magistrate in the county, city or town where such Catholic resided and lists of the persons so taking and subscribing the oath were to be sent every year within twenty one days after the 1st December to the Clerk of the Privy Council. There is a bundle of those lists among the records of the Privy Council Office (4Q.195.16). There is also in the same collection a book described as the Test Book 1775-6 in which the lists were entered up. (1E.15.93). This book contains just over fifteen hundred names (practically all of residents in Leinster and Munster) so that the Act would not seem to have been generally availed of."

Internal evidence bearing out the statement (made on a sheet attached to the notebook) that it was compiled from a source available in the Public Record Office before 1922 was found. On the cover of the Jennings Notebook was the mark 1E.15.93 which proved to be the destination number of the original Test Book not salved from the 1922 destruction. This destination number is to be found opposite the entry Test Book Testifying Allegiance 1775-6 on page 313 of the pre 1922 Record Tower Index; and it is also given in the description quoted from the 42nd Deputy Keeper's Report. Again the original had "just over fifteen hundred names"; the total of the names in the Jennings Notebook is 1526. The period covered in the transcript is 10.8.1775—19.5.1776. Under each locality in which the oath was taken the name of the Judge or Justice before whom the oath was taken is given and also the date. Then follows the list of names of subscribers with addresses and trade, profession or social status. Finally there is a list of counties where the declarations were made and the date the declarations were received is noted in all but two cases. In general these dates correspond with those occurring in the text but not all the dates in the text are accounted for in the list of counties and there are inconsistencies which may have been in the original or may be scribal errors. For example, the date given for the oath taken in Co. Longford in the text is 30 October 1775 while in the list the date is 20 October 1775.

In compliance with the rules of the Public Record Office, Inspector Jennings took the notes in pencil; he later "went over them" in ink. This practice made for difficulty in a number of cases and where deciphering was difficult and the result uncertain a (?) sign has been placed opposite the doubtful quantity in the text and alternatives given. Attention may be drawn to the names for Youghal on page 63; here the difficulty was aggravated by bad alignment and the information given after each name should if possible be corroborated from other

This transcript has been collated with a printed book in the British Museum no. 8145 e 31, entitled: Copies of all the lists which have been returned to the Clerk of the Privy Council, or his deputy, of such Papists as have taken and subscribed the Oath prescribed by the Statute of the thirteenth and fourteenth of his present Majesty, intitled "An Act to enable his majesty's subjects of whatever persuasion to testify their allegiance to him; specifying the Quality, Condition, Title, and Place of Abode of such Papists, and the Time when, the Court or Magistrate before whom, they respectively took the said Oath. (I thank Kevin McGrath B.A. for drawing my attention to this manuscript and also Tomás Ó Laidhin, M.A., who carried out a preliminary examination of the manuscript.) scripts before a photostat copy was purchased). The document here printed and B.M. 8145 e 31 derive from a common source—probably the original lists which were sent to the Clerk of the Privy Council. Their general correspondence was clear despite differences in order of presentation and in the spelling of many personal and place names. Such differences as were thought to be of consequence are indicated in the document here printed, the B.M. forms appearing after an asterisk and within brackets. Obvious mistakes in the B.M. document (e.g., Bunsha for Bansha, Clarestown for Claristown) and small differences in surnames (Brenan for Brennan, Mera for Meara) are not noticed. Five names in the B.M. 8145 e 31 but not in the P.R.O. transcript of the Test Book are printed in their appropriate places. There are six names in the P.R.O. transcript which are not in the B.M. document.

APPENDIX IV.

IRISH VOLUNTEERS FOR THE PAPAL ARMY, 1860

The departure of large numbers of young men from this country to join the Papal army in the summer of 1860 was closely observed by the police. The notice of 16 May (often wrongly referred to as a proclamation), forbidding foreign enlistment seems, for the most part, to have increased the numbers of persons offering themselves as volunteers in the army being assembled in Italy to defend the Papal States. So marked was the increase and the widespread interest in the volunteers that Mr. Sergeant Lawson was asked to advise on the situation. On 22 June 1860 he advised that the whole matter should be formally submitted to the law officers of the Crown. Accordingly a brief—R 129/1860—was prepared by the Crown Solicitor and sent on 7 July 1860 to Lawson, the Attorney-General and to the Solicitor-General. A further statement was prepared and sent out on 14 July 1860.

Crown brief R/129 consists of 26 folios. It relates how in May 1860:

"....collections were made of sums of money by way of contribution to His Holiness the Pope and how that movement was followed, almost accompanied, by a desire to render the Papal Government further assistance by the volunteer aid of men who should go out to Rome for that purpose. The attention of the Government having been called to these matters, notices were printed and posted throughout the metropolis and generally at all public places in Ireland, by which notices the provisions of the act of 59 George III chapter 69 were stated and all persons were thereby warned against a violation of the statute "

"Since the publication of the notices... the Government has received upwards of 150 reports (consisting of about 330 handwritten pages) from various members of the police and constabulary force, detailing in some of them statements made by clergymen from the altar admonishing the authorities for any interference with the people in their anxiety to render the desired aid and pointing out that there could not be any objection made to an emigration and that no one should declare to what place he was destined. Observations of the nature stated are to be found in so many of the reports as having been made from the altars of R.C. chapels that there appears sufficient reason to assume they must be the result of a devised plan of operations...."

"From Cork, Dublin, Sligo, Limerick and Tralee reports have been received stating the departure of successive organized batches of from 12 to 60 persons at a time leaving these places, accompanied frequently, by clergymen, and taking leave of their friends and acquaintances who have collected publicly in large numbers, giving open and unrestrained evidence of the object of their mission to go out and serve the Pope."

Forces, have also joined the movement, and in addition, there has been an extra number of resignations from both Forces, many of the men, so resigning, having been known to have since left the Country.

"Arrangements appear to have been made with Railway Companies for through tickets issued in considerable numbers for the carriage and transport of persons to different parts of England."

"The representations in some places made are, that a Railway is in course of formation at Ancona, and that the men are required to carry on the necessary works there, for a period of four years, and that so soon as their services shall have been dispensed with, passages to any desired part of the Globe will be provided. That in addition promise is made of a considerable bounty, with a pay of 4s. daily. These statements however, are but rumours of the temptations which are held out. They have not been directly communicated by any person about to leave "

"The proprietor of the Nation Newspaper (Dublin Mr. Sullivan) appears to have been an active promoter of the movement in Dublin, he is reported as having been present at the departure from the city of a numerous band of young persons who cheered for the Pope and gave other tokens of their object in leaving Dublin"

"The Constabulary and Police reports shew that many persons have exerted themselves to induce young men to violate the terms of the act 59 Gec. III c. 69 and if further enquiries were now directed they would probably disclose sufficient evidence to justify prosecutions for solicitations to commit misdemeanours."

Four questions were submitted for the consideration of the law officers:

- 1. Whether in your opinion any and what offence has been committed and by whom, by the acts and conduct detailed in the foregoing statement.
- 2. Whether any and what proceedings should be taken and against whom under the circumstances stated.
- 3. Whether any and what further information should be called for on the subject of Foreign Enlistment.
- 4. Whether in your opinion any and what amendment in the Law is required to enable the Government to deal effectively with cases of the nature stated.

The formal consideration of these questions was tardily undertaken. By the time the advice was given—14 December—the Sardinian forces had overcome the resistance of the Papal Army and the Irish volunteers for the most part had returned home. The law officers advised the Lord Lieutenant that:

Although the Act has been violated we do not think that there is sufficient evidence to support a prosecution.

We do not think that any proceedings should be taken, or that any advantage would arise from pursuing the subject any further under existing circumstances.

We do not think that any change in the Law is required.

The Crown brief submitted on 7 July 1860 was followed by a 'further statement' on the 14 July to which was appended.

A Return of Foreign Office passports issued in Dublin to persons 'supposed to have joined the Papal Army from 1st May to 30th June'.

The return was drawn up by Lucius H. Deering, the government passport agent in Dublin. It is a manuscript document of 31 large folios with columns entitled:

- 1. Date (of passport).
- 2. No. of passport
 3. Surname
- 4. Christian name of the same grown and a state of the same of the

 - 5. Destination6. By whom recommended7. To whom delivered8. By whom paid for

In columns 3 and 4, names of 1,132 persons are given, and of these 1,026 gave their destination (column 5) as 'The Continent' 88 as 'Italy 'and 1 as 'Rome'.

The list in this appendix is compiled from:

(i) the 1,132 names in the return of passports (=P.) issued, and

(ii) names of volunteers or persons intending to volunteer for service in Italy, found in the police reports in file 21245/1860 (registered papers).

In the case of names taken from the return, no addresses of persons receiving passports are given but an address is usually given in column 6. As the person recommending the issue of a passport and the persons receiving the passport most likely lived in the same district, the address in column 6 is given in each case preceded by a question mark. It must be pointed out, however, that young men living in the country were in many cases recommended by agents in Dublin.

In the case of names taken from the police reports, the date of the relevant report and the page number in file 21245/1860 is given.
