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#### PREFATORY NOTE.

In the following pages will be found information in connection with the Public Income and Expenditure of Saorstat Eireann for the year ended 31st March, 1923. It should be explained in the first instance that the public revenue and other miscellaneous receipts of the State are paid into a general account called the Exchequer or Central Fund, and it is from this account that the sums required to meet public expenditure are issued. Account No. I. following is the cash account of the Exchequer. On the receipts side thereof is shown the Revenue actually paid into the Exchequer during the course of the year, classified under main headings, and the moneys raised by borrowing. On the payments side, the account shows under the chief headings of Expenditure the sums paid out of the Exchequer to meet the cost of the various Public Services, loans made for sundry purposes, and the amount of borrowings which were repaid. In the succeeding pages are given detailed analyses of all revenue collected and of the various Public Services in respect of which the issues appearing on the payments side of the Exchequer Account were made.

It should be noted that the amounts shown in Account No. I. as issues for Supply Services (and also in Account No. XXIII) represent not the audited expenditure for these services during the year but only the totals of the advances made during the year to the Paymaster-General and the other Principal Accountants out of the moneys voted by the Oireachtas for the several services. The advances so made were based on estimates of expenditure furnished by the different Departments month by month. These advances will, therefore, be a little more or less than actual sums required in each case, but taken in the aggregate they should correspond closely with the exact disbursements as shown in the audited Appropriation Accounts.

The Appropriation Accounts of the several Supply Services for 1922—23 are now in course of examination by the Comptroller and Auditor-General, whose report on these accounts accompanied by copies of the accounts themselves, will be published in due course. It will then be possible to compare the audited expenditure of each service with the provision made for such service in the Votes of the Oireachtas and with the advances made for it out of the Exchequer during the year.

In considering the Revenue figures shown in these Accounts it should be borne in mind that during the year to which they relate the severance of the fiscal system of Saorstat Eireann from that of Great Britain had not yet been effected. Consequently it happened to a considerable extent that revenue was collected in one country which was properly attributable to the other. The Accounts deal generally with Revenue collected in Saorstat Eireann without allowing for the adjustment that is necessary on the ground mentioned. A partial measure of adjustment is effected by the inclusion in Account No. VIII. (Income Tax and Super Tax) of a sum of £1,250,000 transferred from the British Exchequer, but this is offset by the transfer from the Exchequer of Saorstat Eireann of an equivalent amount to the British Board of Customs and Excise (Account No. XXII.). According to the claim made by the British Government the further adjustments necessary involve a net payment of £1,443,461 to the British Exchequer.
