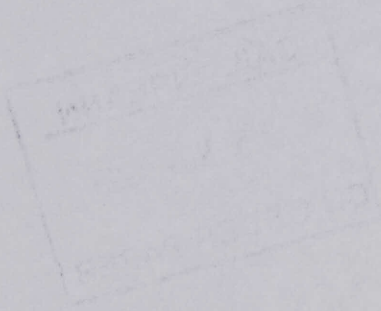


We have the honour to submit our Annual Report for the year ended 31st December, 1990.
