




### How to Register to use the new DocsLaid application


- 1. Click <u>here</u> to register for the new DocsLaid application.
- 2. You can also access the registration form from the <u>DocsLaid page</u> on the Oireachtas website.




3. Insert your email address and press "Send verification code".



4. You will then receive an email with a verification code.








- Use the Internet Explorer Browser

6. Fill in the First Name and Last Name and fields and press "Create".






### How to Register to use the new DocsLaid application


7. Your organisation type (Department or Agency) and your Department or Agency name will be prepopulated based on your email domain.



8. Enter your work phone number in the required format (see red text), and press "Update Profile".

9. When *all* information has been entered press "Request".





10. Your registration request is then sent to the DocsLaid Team. This will be attended to within a \*24-hour period. Your request will display as **"Pending"** until approved.


